

**Testing criteria #4: Multiple section headings on a web page – should we identify type of documents**

- Page contains 7 section headings, each containing a paragraph and a link (*ignore if they go to html pages*)
- Does the page present any contrast issues?
  - If yes, what are the issues?
- Would it be helpful for JAWS if each link was identified (PDF, WORD, EXCEL, etc?)
